

DURING APRIL TO JUNE 2020:

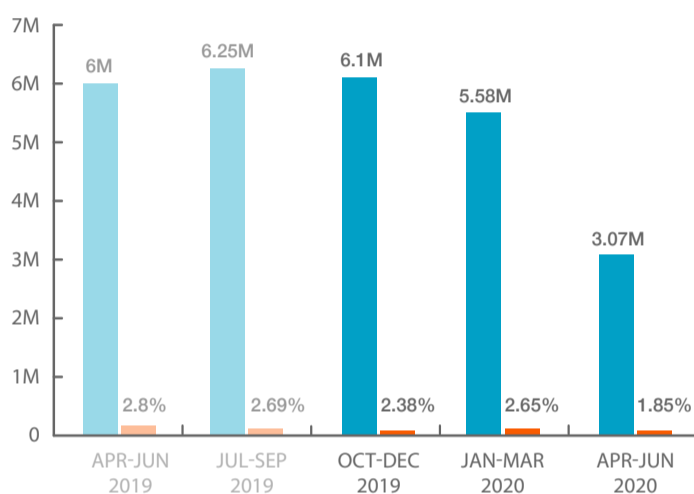
- **JOURNEY NUMBERS INCREASING WEEKLY AS LOCKDOWN ENDS** – by the end of June weekly traffic was at around 70% of pre-lockdown peak levels
- **APRIL WAS THE QUIETEST EVER MONTH ACROSS THE BRIDGE** – but there were still 730,000 journeys made between Runcorn and Widnes
- **OVER 98% OF ALL JOURNEYS WERE PAID FOR ON TIME** – a record high of 98.15% in total, though this small change is partly due to lower traffic levels
- **NUMBER OF PCNs ISSUED AND INCOME FROM PCNs DECREASED SIGNIFICANTLY** – PCNs were still issued during lockdown where people didn't pay, but most enforcement activity has been paused

All revenue, either from tolls/charges or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the new bridge; it is not retained by the council or any of its contractors.

Journey numbers halved under Covid-19 lockdown

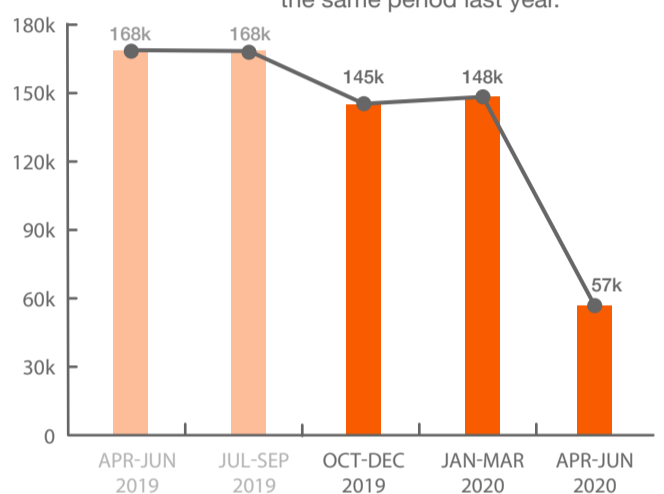
PCNs decreased by 66%* – a drop of 112,000

Over 98% of customers paid their toll/charge on time

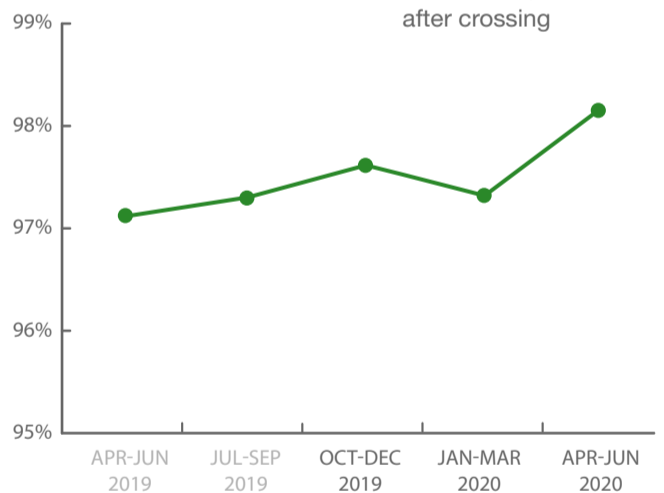

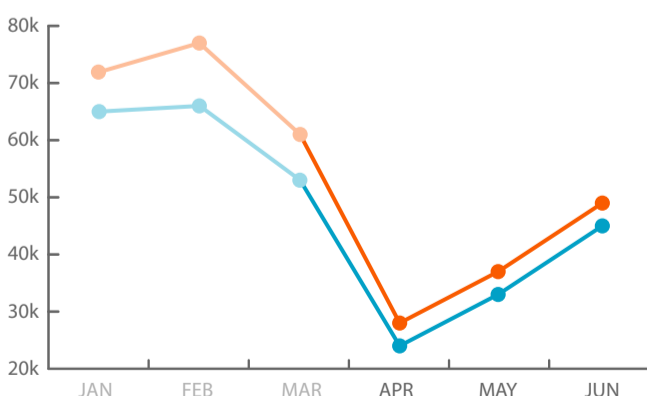

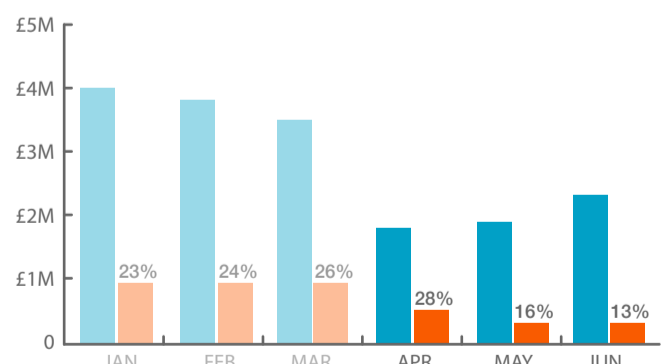
