
DURING JULY TO SEPTEMBER 2022:

- SUMMER 2022 WAS THE SECOND BUSIEST QUARTER FOR TRAFFIC ACROSS THE MERSEY IN THE LAST FIVE YEARS 6,180,000 vehicles crossed the river in Halton, with around 85% of all traffic using the Mersey Gateway Bridge
- OVER 105 MILLION JOURNEYS HAVE BEEN MADE ACROSS THE MERSEY GATEWAY BRIDGE IN
 THE FIRST FIVE YEARS OF ITS LIFE and this summer's average of 74,000 vehicles crossing the river
 each weekday in Halton is one of the highest figures since the bridge opened
- **JOURNEY NUMBERS ARE UP AND PCN LEVELS ARE DOWN YEAR ON YEAR –** quarterly journey numbers for the summer 2022 period were up by 280,000 compared to 2021, while PCN numbers fell by 7,000
- BOTH BRIDGES SEE TRAFFIC VOLUMES INCREASE the average daily number of vehicles crossing each bridge grew by about 1,000 a day compared to the previous quarter
- OVER 97.3% OF JOURNEYS WERE PAID FOR ON TIME the vast majority of people are paying for their
 journeys by midnight the day after they cross

All revenue, either from tolls/charges or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the Mersey Gateway Bridge. It is not retained by the council or any of its contractors.



Total journeys and number of PCNs issued




PCNs down year on year as a % of journey numbers






Bridge usage from July – September 2022
