

DURING JULY TO SEPTEMBER 2019:

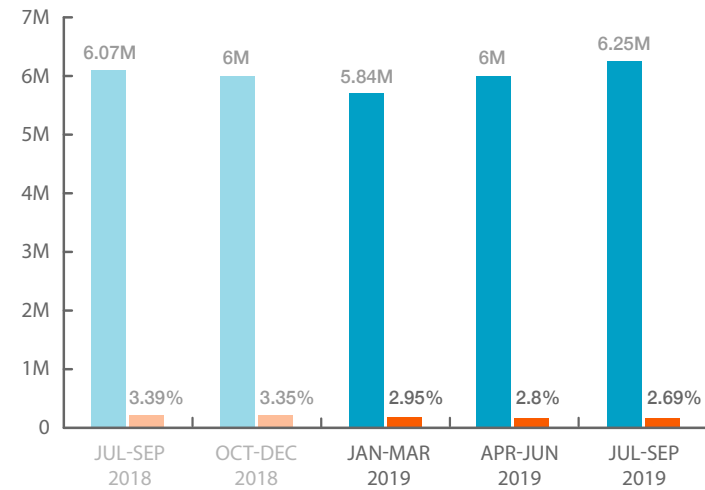
- **18.5% REDUCTION IN THE NUMBER OF PCNs** issued compared to the same time last year (a drop of 38,000)
- **JOURNEY NUMBERS INCREASED BY 3%** compared to the same time last year – up to 6.25 million
- **97.3% OF JOURNEYS WERE PAID FOR ON TIME** – this is the highest ever rate
- **JULY WAS THE HIGHEST EVER MONTH** for crossings made across the bridge (2.14 million)

All revenue, either from tolls/charges or PCNs, contributes towards payment for the new bridge; it is not retained by the Council or any of its contractors.

Journeys increased by 3%* – up to 6.25M

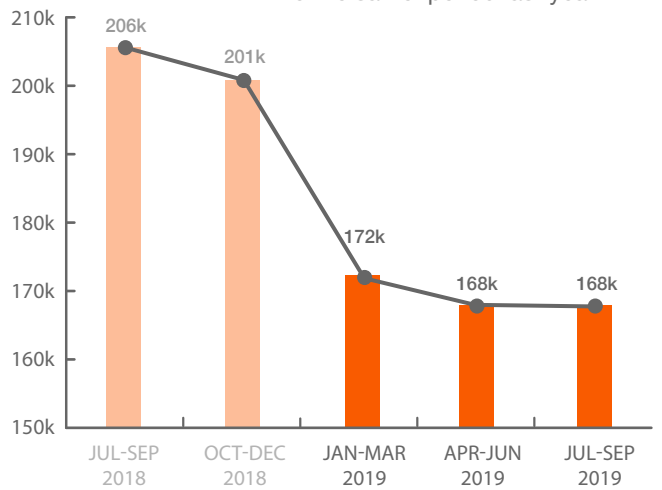
PCNs decreased by 18.5%* – a drop of 38,000

*Comparing July–September 2019 to the same period last year.



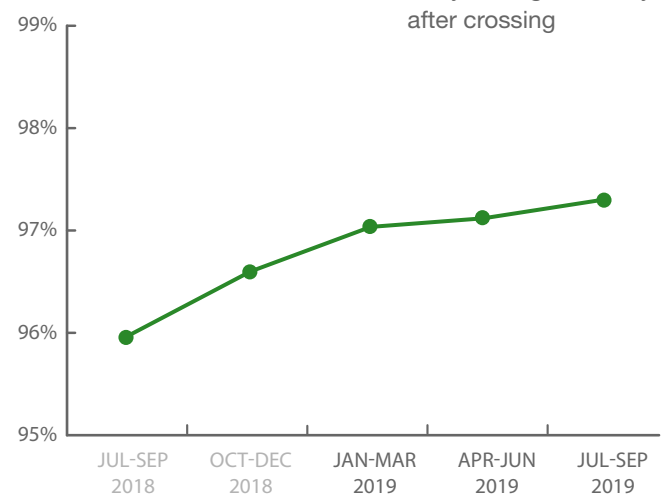

Over 97% of customers paid their toll/charge on time

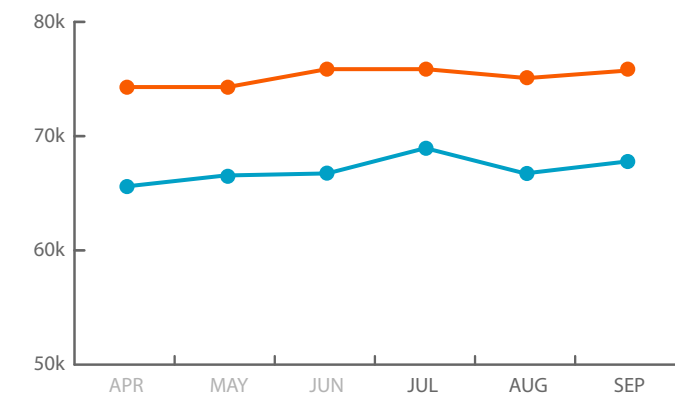

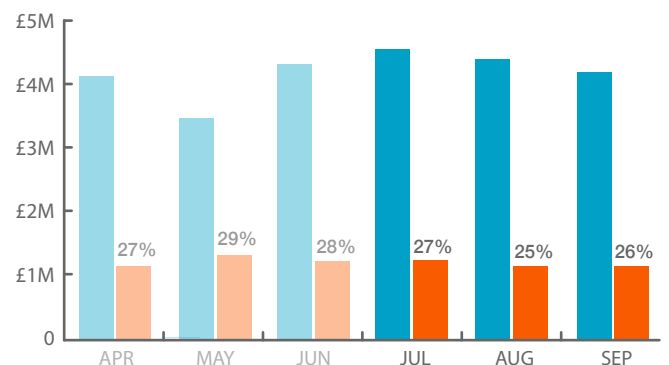


Average traffic (in 000s)
